Opening:

The regular meeting of the Pleasant Hill Park Board was called to order at 7:16pm on Tuesday, April 14, 2015 in the Council Chambers at the Pleasant Hill City Hall by Park Board President Auggie Augspurg.

Present:

Board members in attendance were Auggie Augspurg, Jeff Stith, David Whitaker, Clay Hocker, Christy Reeves, Tria Cartner, and Parks & Rec Director Justin Wieberg. Guests in attendance were C.J. Hicks, Mark Randall, and Nick Ryan.

Consent Agenda:

Christy made the motion to accept the consent agenda as presented. Jeff Stith seconded the motion and passed unanimously.

Old Business:

*Park Maintenance Update – Complex work, including Goppert sign, pipe, and wall have been completed. Contract mowing approved by City Council last night.

*Rec Complex Land – Space for new fields, plenty of area to add up to 4 fields. Turned fields around and determined that there would be room to make a cloverleaf. Jeff will draw up a design for what we might want to pursue before we can get estimates.

*TRIM – Chuck Conner will help put grant application together. Deadline is first Friday in June. Ideas include trees at City Lake, Soccer Complex, trails, Rec Complex, and Porter Park. Will need to determine what kinds of trees to plant – fast growing and shade.

New Business:

*Fitness Park Land Sale – Josh Curtis wants to buy land behind his house. Board decided that before anything else is done that Justin needs to approach Goppert is okay with it. Justin also will check on survey costs.

Comments by Board & Public:

*Auggie – Conservation Department has a program coming up in a couple of weeks on care and stocking of ponds. It was suggested someone from the department attend.

*Auggie – Mountain bike trail people are chomping at the bit to get started. Auggie pointed out a few challenges they might come across with landscape. Tria has been in

contact with several from their group and is in their email group – She will keep us posted.

Director's Report May 12, 2015

Maintenance:

Personnel – Josh and Mike have some help now with Jacob Pilcher starting on April 21st. Eric Vestal will be joining them on May 18th; we will have another guy start around that time but he has yet to be determined.

They have been busy pouring concrete at the Dog Park for the sidewalk leading to the parking lot and pad in the Large Dog area. There is one more pad to pour so we're waiting on the PMBF to form up the remaining pad in the Small Dog area connecting to the double gate next to the main entrance.

Park Improvements – The tennis courts and basketball court has been resurfaced. We're waiting for the parking lots at the City Park and Dog Park to be completed.

Recreation:

Youth Girls Volleyball – Playoff tournament was May 9th.

Youth Baseball/Softball – Rec games will start May 18th and practices will cease after that point. Competitive Baseball games will still be going on.

Adult Men's Basketball Session 2 – Playoff tournament will be on May 17th!

Aquatics

Pool has been filled. Nathan and Jill started yesterday to get everything organized. Lifeguards and concessions stand workers have been selected. Training for each will happen this week through the weekend.

Administration

Collected bids for the Depot Furnace and has already been taken care of. Ordered signs and brochures for the WE TIP program implementation; we will have a staff training as soon as schedules permit. Currently collecting prices for lighting contractors for the Rec Complex.

Hi Justin,

I plan on just maintaining it. Meaning general cleanup of down trees and limbs. I have been mowing 20' or so beyond my property line as well as keeping it cleaned up from fallen limbs etc (helps with ticks and snakes). There are a couple dead or near dead trees just over my property line that I would cut down. I do not want to remove any other trees (it's basically all wooded land). I would likely add a few more specimen trees at the start of the tree line just to give a better view from the back of my house. Not anytime soon, I would consider adding a small shed just over my current property line. The shed would be small and not car accessible or of that size. The shed isn't critical to me but would be something I would like to do at some point. I would likely pitch a tent from time to time with the kiddos as well – gives a better camping feel than just the back yard. In short I would just like to extend my property and ensure it stays as is (woods behind the house was a key reason we bought the house). And the work I put into maintaining it would be done as my property.

Below is poorly done markup by me showing the portion I am interested in buying. In the past Bryan and park board was willing to sell that portion of land but I just got busy with things and stopped pursuing it. I attached a pdf that Bryan had supplied that shows the area a little better. You'll also notice in the pdf Bryan was only willing if I took the little slice behind lot 87 as well so that little section is left hanging out there.

The purpose for me is just to extend my land, as you can tell building on it wouldn't be an option and is only accessible from my yard. The land stays wet most of the time especially near the creek.


Can you let me know if this is something you are interested in? Hopefully it will provide a benefit to me and the city would receive some money to help in another park area.

Harvest Run 5K

What: 5K run and Kid's run

When: Saturday November 7 at 7:45 AM

Why: Charity run corresponding with the United Methodist Church's Harvest Dinner
With proceeds going to help those in Pleasant Hill.

Where: The proposed route will start and end at the Pleasant Hill United Methodist Church. The Route will go south on Lexington to Myrtle, East on Myrtle past the middle school, Around the parking lot at the high school and return.

We will provide volunteers at all intersections along the route (Wright, Sycamore, Maple, Baltimore, Delaware, Country Club and Crest) to direct traffic safely around the Runners. We will notify the neighborhood in advance so they can prepare for potential Delays when traveling that morning. Our hope is to have 150 – 200 runners/walkers Participating. With that in mind the actual delay at any one intersection will be less than A few minutes at most. With a walking pace of 15 minutes per mile, even the walking Participants will be north of Country Club on their return to the church by 8:25 at the Latest and off of the roads by 9:00. With the projected sunrise being 6:58, we could Move the race up to 7:30 to reduce the potential traffic issues.

Misc.: Parking will be in the church parking lot. If overflow is needed we will defer to the city As to what is the best course of action for additional cars.

We will provide port-a-potties at the church.



WeTip's Community Safety Program

You can call this number 24 hours a day

WeTip's Anonymous Crime Hotline is a way for citizens to get involved in establishing a safer community. Residents are often afraid to report crime information because they fear reprisal from the person they are reporting. WeTip gives community members an opportunity to give information without fear.

When you call the WeTip hotline, the first words you will hear from the operator will be, "This is the WeTip crimeline, please do not give your name." The operator will then ask a series of questions, designed by law enforcement, to obtain the maximum amount of information about the reported crime, then the information is conveyed to the appropriate police, fire, and law enforcement agencies.

After the information is taken, if the informant requests a reward, a code name and number are assigned to the informant. **The caller always remains absolutely anonymous (not just confidential).**

Cash rewards of up to \$1000 are given upon verified reports from law enforcement that WeTip information was received prior to arrest and that the information was helpful in the arrest and conviction.

The reward drop is made at a designated postal location, using the assigned code names and case numbers. No personal contact is ever made with the informant.

No one will ask your name, you will remain anonymous.
