Pleasant Hill Park Board Regular Meeting Minutes Tuesday, March 12, 2019 Pleasant Hill City Hall

Opening:

The regular meeting of the Pleasant Hill Board was called to order at 7:00pm on Tuesday, March 12, 2019 in the Council Chambers at the Pleasant Hill City Hall by Park Board President Auggie Augspurg.

Present:

Board members in attendance Auggie Augsburg, Andy Bailey, Linda Ewing, Nancy Baker, Mark Crain, and Jay English. Also in attendance were Tria Cartner, Justin Wieberg, Nick Althauser, and Shelby Teufel.

Consent Agenda:

Shore made the motion to accept the consent agenda. Bailey seconded the motion and it passed unanimously.

Regular Agenda:

1. Amend Minutes - February 12, 2019

Shore made the motion to accept the Amended Minutes. Bailey seconded the motion and it passed unanimously.

2. Old and New Business

- a. Discussion: Community Garden Cathy Gilbert (N)
 - -Cathy presented her idea to utilize the land west of the pool as a Community Garden. She has spoken with this idea with Shelby in January.
 - -Cathy plans to create a Community Garden Board of 5-7 members, including representation from the Park Board. Baker volunteered to be that representation.
 - -About 40 volunteers have shown interest in the project.
 - -There will be a \$40 membership fee to harvest food from the garden. Leftover food goes to the lay clergy. Will this fee cover installation of spigots, etc?
 - -A small business will install fence installation.
 - -Asking city for water meter, spigot (2) installation, and Porta Potty
 - -Total cost \$1328 for the year with recurring cost of \$400/year. Since it is a water tap, specifically, can it come from the city water fund?
 - -Community Garden Board will pay the water bill.
 - -Crain mentioned KC Community Garden Grants and resources to help with costs. 12-18 month turnaround and highly competitive to receive.
 - -Shore mentioned tapping into the Beautification Project for funding/grant.
 - -Can funds come from private donors and businesses?
 - -Do we add to the Priority List?
 - -A soil test prior to moving forward was suggested due to the leaking from the pool.
 - -Parks maintenance staff will maintain the land around the garden.
 - -Row gardens rather than raised beds for higher yields. Raised bed for herbs.
 - -Looking for scouts and other groups to work in the garden.

-There will be online registration for members to sign up.

The Park Board recommends the Community Garden to be put in place, funded by the City Council or private donor, not funded by the Park Board.

b. Sub-Committee Reports

- i. MOPAC Trail Promotions (O)
 - -The Trail Subcommittee came up with 3 main areas in which to focus.
 - 1. Create a complete resource of trail information (online AND print) that is easy to share, linked to sites, etc.
 - 2. Market trails using these materials to locals and out of towners and external organizations.
 - Showcase trails or encourage other entities to use our trails. May encourage
 Park Department to put on trail challenges for our community and events like
 National Trail Day
 - -NPRA (grant for online presence) to get all MO Trails on one map (visitmissouritrails.com).
 - -Create an insert to put in water bill to guide PH residents toward the online trail resource.
 - -October 11-MO Life Magazine announces PH as final stop for the Big Bam ride.
- ii. Update: Pool Subcommittee
 - -Wieberg spoke with Kaitlyn (concessions) about the list of improvements needed for pool and concessions.
 - -Pool rental info online (lessons, passes, etc).
- c. Update: City Lake Trails (Andy)
 - -¾ done with the west side trail.
 - -Group work day 03/16/19.
 - -We are finalists for the People for Bikes grant. We need letters from local businesses and city members to show support to submit final grant April 5.
 - -Trail Fest-Hippie's Magic Carpets is donating 100 shirts to early registrants by April 26.
 - -Charlotte Long (BBQ place)-offered to prepare and serve Trail Fest food.
 - -Whitaker offered to do the same if Long BBQ falls through.
 - -Boulevard is donating beer (do we need a festival permit)?
 - -Bailey made the proposal for backcountry primitive campsites on the trail.
 - -Bailey wants to do a one year review after having the primitive campsites to see how it's working out.

The Park Board supports Andy's proposal for the 2 primitive campsites along the MoPac Singletrack with location approval by Wieberg.

Motion: Heather Shore Second: Mark Crain Unanimous vote.

- 2. Comments from the Board Members and Public:
 - a. Sara Althauser presented information about building a pump track in Pleasant Hill. She is going to do some more research and bring it back.
 - b. Shore asked when the city wide garage sale dates were determined to be. Weekend of May 10, 11.
 - c. Bailey proposed again determining which park areas maintained and funded by the city can possibly be assumed by the HOA. Specifically the Children's Memorial at the front of Sugarland. Jay Walters will be the HOA representative to approach on this.
- 3. Next meeting is April 9, 2019.
- 4. Bordner made the motion to adjourn, Bailey seconded the motion and it passed unanimously. Meeting adjourned 8:30pm.
