

TEMPORARY SIGN PLACEMENT

Temporary signs such as yard/garage sale, local community activities, etc. are allowed to be placed along city streets if they are placed in compliance with city regulations. You may not be aware that signs placed in a right-of-way along both city streets and state highways are in violation of city regulations. As a rule of thumb, as you are placing your temporary signs along Highway 7 and 58, place your signs behind the power poles to keep in compliance with regulations. Sign placement must also take into consideration the site triangle at intersections. The site triangle is, at a minimum, 25 feet in each direction from the corner of the intersection. (see diagram) This maintains that the line of sight for vehicle traffic remains clear and safe. Temporary signs in violation of regulations may be removed by city staff at any time. SNOW REMOVAL
