Mayor John King further eased restrictions on the Water Emergency for Pleasant Hill Water customers. Customers are able to resume water consumption for daily activities but water conservation efforts for sprinkler systems are in effect, under a Phase 1 water emergency.

The use of sprinklers and irrigation systems shall utilize the following schedule. This applies to both residential and commercial properties on the City's water supply system.

- Addresses ending in even numbers (0, 2, 4, 6, 8) can water on Mondays, Wednesdays, and Fridays
- Addresses ending in odd numbers (1, 3, 5, 7, 9) can water on Tuesdays, Thursdays, and Saturdays

Customers can resume watering of gardens, washing of cars, boats, and trailers.

The emergency declaration was originally put in effect in response to reduced water supply as a result of pump failures within the City's water system. The elevation within the City's water tower has steadily increased since a pump was placed in service in the afternoon of July 4, 2023.

Phase 2 restrictions were removed on July 5.

Customers are still asked to conserve water where possible and are reminded that a boil advisory remains in effect through at least the afternoon on Thursday, July 6, 2023.
